

## CONCEPT: The importance of the evaluation process

**Evaluation** is the “systematic and objective assessment of an ongoing or completed project, programme or policy, its design, implementation and results.”

**Evaluation** is a key learning tool for the European Union to generate knowledge and produce evidence which we use to improve the way we engage with our partners and enhance the impact of our development co-operation.

## MAIN OBJECTIVES

### Definition of the Evaluation Plan

Base tool for the correct monitoring and evaluation of EU-JAMRAI objectives.

### Development of Evaluation Tools

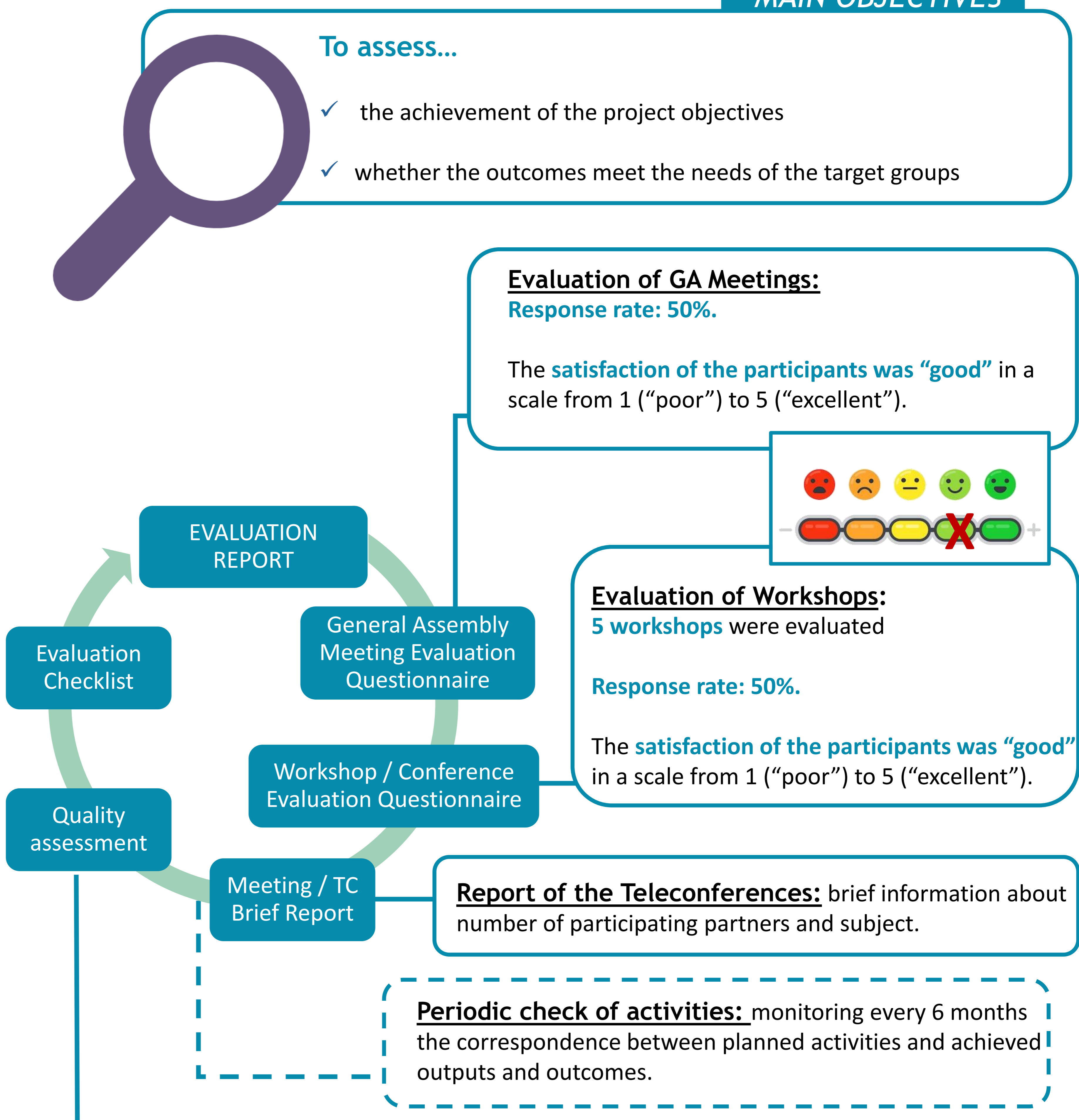
for monitoring the activities carried out in EU-JAMRAI. All tools were tested and validated before their Implementation.

### Interim and Final Evaluation

Report of the level of compliance with EU-JAMRAI objectives. Monitor the implementation process of activities through established indicators.

### To assess...

- ✓ the achievement of the project objectives
- ✓ whether the outcomes meet the needs of the target groups



### Evaluation of GA Meetings:

Response rate: 50%.

The **satisfaction of the participants** was “good” in a scale from 1 (“poor”) to 5 (“excellent”).



### Evaluation of Workshops:

5 workshops were evaluated

Response rate: 50%.

The **satisfaction of the participants** was “good” in a scale from 1 (“poor”) to 5 (“excellent”).

**Report of the Teleconferences:** brief information about number of participating partners and subject.

**Periodic check of activities:** monitoring every 6 months the correspondence between planned activities and achieved outputs and outcomes.

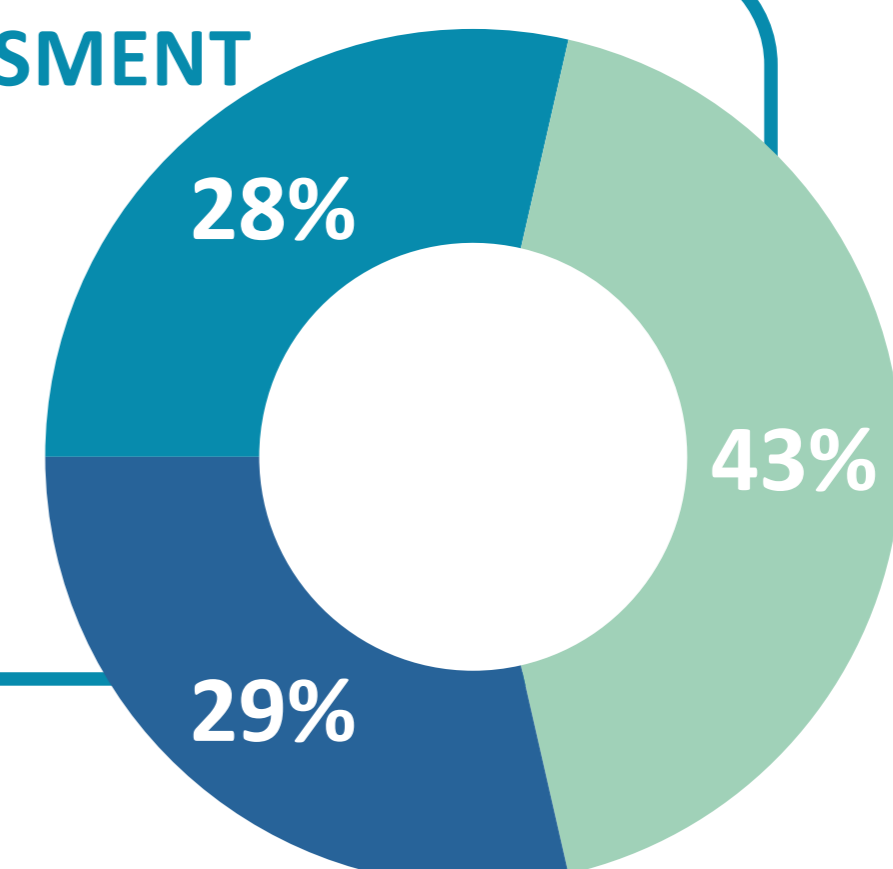
Assessing EU-JAMRAI most relevant deliverables, conducting internal and external evaluations.

### Preliminary results:

- 6 deliverables evaluated by stakeholders
- 7 evaluations out of 12 planned
