1 EU-JAMRAI2 PROJECT

EU-JAMRAI2, the second edition of the European Joint Action on Antimicrobial Resistance and Healthcare Associated Infections, emerges with the ambitious goal of changing the world's approach to antimicrobial resistance (AMR) through a One Health perspective, with several pivotal objectives for the implementation of state-of-the-art Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures and Antimicrobial Stewardship (AMS) strategies across diverse settings (human, animal and environmental health). EU-JAMRAI2 will also support Member States/Associated Countries (MS/AC) in their efforts to develop and update their National Action Plan (NAP) on AMR.

The European One Health Action Plan against AMR is urging to make the EU a best practice region. Furthermore, and according to the European Commission guidelines, the control of AMR can only be achieved by combining strong IPC measures with AMS programmes. Despite current plans and guidelines, EU Member States haven't reached the same level of proficiency concerning health policies on AMS and IPC. Following the policy recommendations from the first EU-JAMRAI (2017-2021), establishing harmonized core elements and standards at the European level is considered a priority for effective implementation of AMS and IPC programmes and a minimum framework to be used by all EU Member States.

This workshop is organized within the framework of Task 6.2 and Task 7.2 of the EU-JAMRAI2 project, focusing on AMS and IPC in animal health, respectively. The goal of the workshop is to enable the exchange of experiences, models and synergies between the human and animal health sector and identify core elements and competencies for the development and implementation of IPC and AMS programmes in the animal health sector.

3 VENUE

The Workshop “Antimicrobial Stewardship (AMS) and Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) in animal health” jointly organized by Task 6.2 and 7.2 will be held in Hotel Meliá in Bilbao (Spain).

3.1 Getting to the venue

The hotel is located 0.75 km from the Guggenheim museum and 2 km from Old town Bilbao.

- BY UNDERGROUND (Metro)

The nearest stop is Moyua (exit for Ercilla-Guggenheim). From the exit, walk down Calle Elcano towards the estuary (in the direction of Abandoibarra), keeping the Government House building on your left, and when you come to the Euskadi roundabout, turn into Calle Lehendakari Leizaola and continue until you reach the Meliá Hotel. It is about a 900m distance. [Link](#)

- BY TRAM

The nearest stop is Abandoibarra, which is right by the Meliá Hotel. It is about 200m distance. [Link](#)

- BY BUS

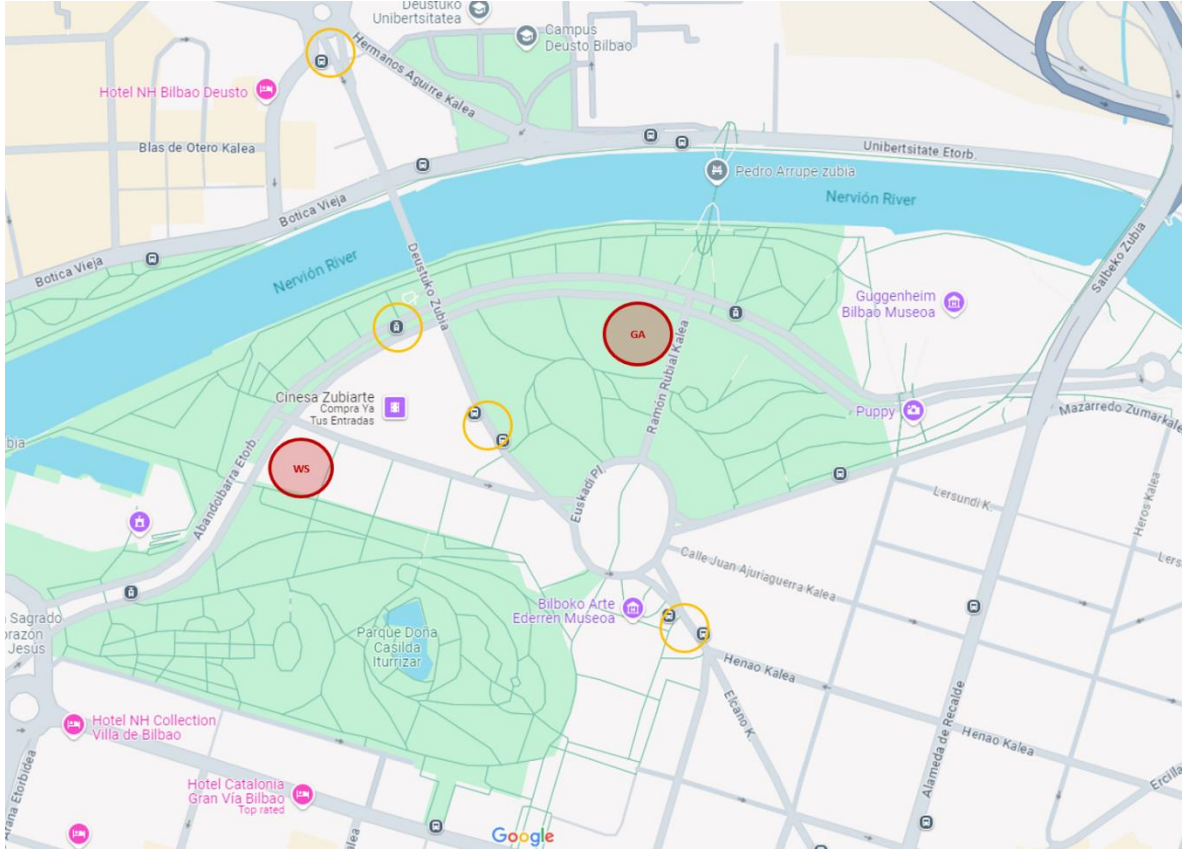
[Bilbobus](#): LINES 1, 10, 13 and 18 stopping on Deusto bridge (closest bus stop).

[Bizkaibus](#): Lines A2153, A2314, A2322, A3225, A3411, A3516, A3517, A3518, A3527, stopping at Plaza del Museo) and Line A3223, stopping at the Universidad de Deusto (in this case you have to cross the estuary via the Pedro Arrupe footbridge).



- BY CAR

The nearest carpark is Parking de la Plaza Euskadi (in the square of the same name). The entrance is in Calle Ramón Rubial. It is about a two-minute walk.



3.2 Getting to Bilbao (Bizkaia, Spain)

Bilbao's airport is a Spanish International Airport located 12 kilometers from the city center, being the most important airport in the extreme north of Spain. Its facilities and terminal are in the municipality of Sondika to the southwest, and in the municipality of Loiu to the northeast. From there, you can easily reach the city center:

- BY TAXI

There is a taxi rank in the airport arrivals area. It takes around 15 - 20 minutes to the city center and it costs around 25€ - 30€.

- BY BUS

Airport shuttle buses are operating between the Airport and Bilbao city center in a 15-20 minutes frequency. The ticket can be bought directly in the bus and it costs around 3€.

- RENTAL CAR

The rental car offices are located in the lobby of the P1 Parking Building level 0, which is connected to the level 0 of the passenger terminal through an underground passage. All car rental companies have a large fleet of rental vehicles, so you can choose the one that suits you according to your needs and for the time you need.

3.3 Getting around Bilbao

The underground (Metro Bilbao) is one of the most efficient means of transport to get around Bilbao. It takes you to most tourist attractions and connects the city to Gran Bilbao on both the right and the left banks of the estuary. Bilbobus (city) and Bizkaibus (intercity) buses provide useful connections too, while the Euskotren rail lines take you to visit the region and the province of Gipuzkoa too. If you want to soak in the Bilbao cityscape, you should take the tram, leading to the top tourist attractions in town, like the Guggenheim Museum or the Arriaga Theatre.

In Bizkaia you can try traditional dishes, taste modern meals rewarded with a Michelin star, go after the latest trends in international cuisine or learn how to make Basque delicacies in a cooking workshop. We list several recommendations for eating in Bilbao pintxos or restaurants, so that you choose what best suits to your plan. And for dessert...you can find the most famous pastry shops, cafeterias and ice cream parlors in the city.

6.2 Pintxos in Bilbao

Pintxos are a must in the whole Basque Country. These bite-size culinary treasures are deeply rooted in Basque culinary traditions. Here, they are not named “tapas”, are called Pintxos, and finding a bar full of them and having a hard time choosing which one you ask for is something you can start assuming right away. Some options would be:

The Casco Viejo (Old Town): throughout Bilbao’s Old Town there are establishments offering a wide range of pintxos, clustering in places like the Plaza Nueva, Calle del Perro or Somera. The most typical pintxos and portions include squid in batter, breaded mussels, mushrooms, cod, peppers and omelette. Highlights in the Plaza Nueva include Sorginzulo, with specialities like ham croquettes and anglerfish and prawns, and Gure Toki that serves black pudding with baby squid, cod in pil-pil sauce or Idiazabal cheese soup with mushrooms and quail egg. The historic Víctor Montes boasts a highly recommended bar groaning with the most traditional of pintxos. On the other side of the estuary in

old Bilbao you'll find the area around the Marzana dock, with several establishments where you can taste the finest pintxos.

Ledesma Street: it is another of the great classics to eat in Bilbao pintxos. Recommendation: Try the guilds (gildas) at Promenade Vermutería y Tapería, a small place with a terrace specializing in vermouth and guilds, these olives with anchovy and chilli a bit spicy.

Diputación Street: our recommendations are the following: La Viña del Ensanche, ham snacks, cazuelas and hot pintxos made at the moment. El Globo. It has several internationally awarded pintxos, and some of the most famous in Bilbao: Txangurro gratinado and cod gratinado.

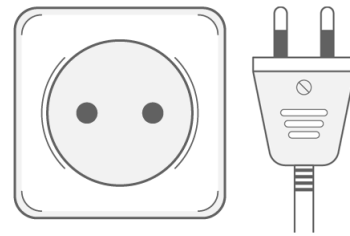


